# The Iowa Coalition Against Sexual Assault:

- ◆ **IowaCASA** began in 1981 and incorporated as non-profit in 1982. IowaCASA formed in order to unite Iowa's sexual assault crisis centers to advance policy on behalf of sexual assault survivors.
- ◆ Today **IowaCASA** has 28 member centers serving sexual assault survivors throughout Iowa.
- ◆ **IowaCASA** has 16 full and part time staff members who work on several initiatives including:
  - ◇ Technical assistance and training to member centers
  - ◇ Civil legal assistance for survivors of sexual assault, including immigration assistance
  - ◇ Improving responses to sexual assault within communities of color
  - ◇ Statewide sexual assault prevention and training for allied professionals
  - ◇ Public policy efforts at the state and national levels
  - ◇ Several national technical assistance projects that coordinate assistance to other sexual assault coalitions, sexual assault services provided by rural grantees, and assistance to administrators of the Sexual Assault Services Program

## Technical Assistance

**IowaCASA** provides technical assistance and training to our member sexual assault centers as well as community partners and allied organizations. IowaCASA staff is available to answer questions on a variety of issues ranging from service delivery and program concerns to public policy advancement. ## Civil Legal Assistance

**IowaCASA's** Legal Assistance to Victims Program provides information and referrals for legal issues related to sexual assault. IowaCASA's attorneys provide legal representation to sexual assault survivors in civil cases including family, juvenile and immigration matters. The program also provides resources, information, and training to advocates working on legal issues related to Iowa law.
