WHAT WE DO

The Iowa Coalition Against Sexual Assault (IowaCASA) provides training, resources, and support across the state to 25 rape crisis centers, culturally specific programs, emergency sheltering programs, and allied agencies that work with survivors of sexual violence and domestic abuse.

- IowaCASA connects survivors of sexual violence to free and confidential services in their area.
- We advocate on behalf of survivors and victim service programs at the lowa Capitol.
- We provide survivors in middle schools, high schools, and colleges with free civil legal aid through our legal clinic.
- We support prevention efforts across the state so that we can stop sexual violence before it occurs.
- We work with underserved communities including people of color and incarcerated individuals to improve and expand access to services.
- We provide bilingual assistance in Spanish to victim service programs and Latino survivors.

HOW CAN I HELP A SURVIVOR?

If someone you know has been sexually assaulted, start by believing them unconditionally. Remind the survivor that it wasn't their fault. When a survivor shares their story with you, listen to them. Respect the survivor's personal boundaries. Provide information, not advice. And remember—you might also need support.

EVERY SURVIVOR IS DIFFERENT

Every survivor reacts to sexual violence in a different way—and that's okay. Some survivors might talk openly about what happened to them. Others might not want to talk at all, keeping their emotions inside. Some survivors want to wait weeks, months, or even years before discussing their sexual assault. Others might want to talk about it with someone right away.

If you are supporting someone you know who has been sexually assaulted, it's important to respect their personal choices as they cope with sexual violence in their own way.

ADVOCATES ARE AVAILABLE

Advocates are professionals trained and certified by IowaCASA to support survivors of sexual violence. They offer information, emotional support, and help to find resources within survivors' communities. Advocates work in all of Iowa's 99 counties.
